Document 1: "The TRC", by Zapiro¹, in *Mail & Guardian*, 2000

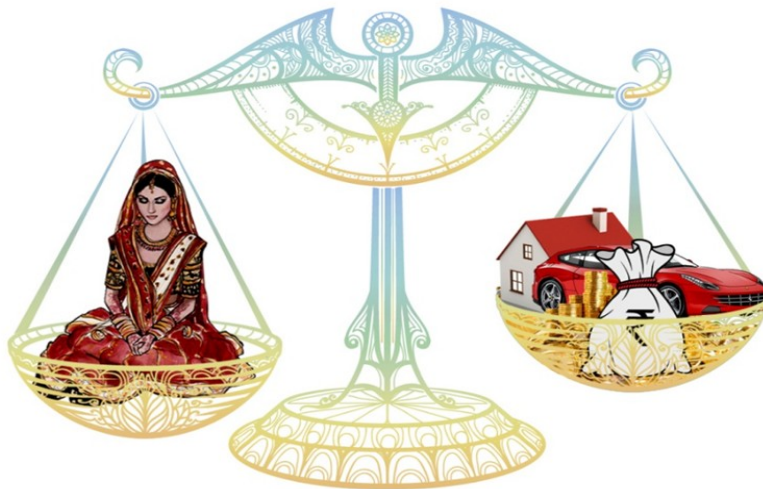


¹ Jonathan Shapiro, known as Zapiro is a white South African, the most famous South African political cartoonist born in Cape Town in 1958.

Text as published with the document:

And before that, one minute wait! Pandit (Hindu priest) and 500 relatives to be fed. Only then giving blessings."

² A crore is a unit of measurement commonly used in India, Bangladesh, Nepal, and Pakistan to represent 10 million. It's derived from the Sanskrit word "koti," which means ten million.
